- 1. skeleton It is made of all the bones inside the body.
- 2. bone marrow Soft substance inside bones.
- 3. cartilage A firm, elastic, flexible type of connective tissue.
- 4. skull The bony framework of the head.
- 5. ribs The bones in your chest.
- 6. spine The spinal or vertebral column.
- 7. long bones The bones in your arms and legs are long bones.
- 8. joints The movable place or part where two bones of a skeleton join.
- 9. hinge joints They let bones move back and forth, knees and elbows are hinge joints.
- 10. pivot joints They let bones turn and twist.
- 11. ball and socket joints They allow one bone to be moved in a circle while another stays still.
- 12. sliding joint They allow bones to turn and bend, they are found in the spine.
- 13. fixed joints They hold bones in place with no movement, they are found in the skull.
- 14. tendons They are long, thin bands that tie muscles to bones.

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
